The SPA-AAP Pediatric Anesthesiology 2025 meeting program brings together experts from clinical and basic science disciplines related to pediatric medicine, anesthesia, and surgery. General topic areas include anatomy, pathophysiology, anesthetic pharmacology, sedation, pain management, patient safety, and child advocacy. We will also discuss practice and career management issues. The presentation format is varied, and includes lectures and refresher courses, panel discussions, hands-on workshops and problem-based learning discussions. Additionally, an important part of the program is the presentation of new clinical and basic science research in oral and moderated poster discussion forums.

Abstract submissions from investigators engaged in scientific work or case studies focused in the following areas will be considered:



Congenital Cardiac Anesthesia Society (CCAS) – 2025 Annual Meeting March 27, 2025

The Annual Meeting of the Congenital Cardiac Anesthesia Society provides a forum for learning to providers who care for patients with **congenital heart disease (CHD)**. The program is designed to promote scientific learning, interactive discussion, and hands-on experiences in the field of CHD, with an emphasis on anesthetic and intraoperative management.

The CCAS meeting encourages novel scientific work through abstract displays and moderated discussions. Abstracts submitted for consideration will be accepted based on their scientific validity, presentation, and relevance to the field of CHD. <u>Abstracts not pertaining to pediatric or congenital</u> cardiac anesthesia will NOT be considered for the CCAS meeting.



Society for Pediatric Pain Medicine (SPPM) – 12th Annual Meeting March 27, 2025

The Society for Pediatric Pain Medicine is dedicated to education focused on **the prevention**, **assessment**, **and management of pain in infants**, **children**, **and adolescents**. The overall goals for attendees of the program are to enhance their existing fund of knowledge, and to introduce them to new and state of the art techniques and information that affect their practice and improve the care for children in pain.

The SPPM meeting invites abstract submissions from investigators engaged in scientific work focused on pediatric pain medicine. All presenters of accepted posters will participate in a moderated poster discussion at the SPPM meeting, and awards will be presented to the best abstracts, Examples of topic areas include but are not limited to acute pain, chronic pain, regional anesthesia, palliative care and the science of pain. Criteria for acceptance of abstracts and awards judging will be a) scientific validity b) presentation and c) relevance to pediatric pain medicine. Abstracts with preliminary data, but not projects in the development phase, will be considered. Exceptional case reports describing novel approaches or events related to pediatric pain medicine will also be considered. Abstracts not pertaining to the prevention, assessment, and management of pediatric pain will NOT be considered for the SPPM meeting
